

RULES AND REGULATIONS

C. FIRE CODE REGULATIONS

1. Licensee, show management, exhibitors, and all other parties must comply with all Federal, State, Municipal, and Center mandated fire codes, which apply to public assembly facilities. The Center includes sections of the NFPA Life Safety Code, which apply to public assembly facilities, as part of the License Agreement.
2. Crate storage is prohibited in the Center. Crate storage is the responsibility of the Licensee.
3. All bunting, table coverings, drapes, signs, banners, and like materials must be flame resistant and are subject to inspection and flame testing by the Fire Marshal.
4. All electrical equipment must conform to the National Electrical Code and be UL approved.
5. The following materials are prohibited without prior written consent of the Center: electrical cooking equipment; open flame devices; vehicles, welding, cutting or brazing equipment; ammunition; radioactive devices; flammable liquid pressure vessels; exhibits involving hazardous processing and materials; fireworks or pyrotechnics; blasting agents or explosives; flammable cryogenic gases; aerosol cans with flammable propellants; gas operated cooking equipment; portable heating equipment; other equipment, materials, and operations that increase risk to fire and life safety.
6. The possession of a dangerous weapon is prohibited in the Center, except as provided below. Concealed weapons are strictly prohibited in the Center.
7. Firearms are prohibited in the Center, unless they form part of a display or integral to an event, and prior written approval has been obtained from the Center. The exhibitor must comply with all Federal, State, and Local laws governing the possession and/or use and/or sale of firearms in the State of Connecticut. Firearms may not be loaded or fired in the Center. Firearms must be deactivated by removal of the firing pin, bolt, or otherwise altered so that they are incapable of being fired.
8. Power and primers are prohibited in the Center. Firearms and ammunition will be inspected by an authorized safety inspector approved by the Center, during Event move-in and/or such other times determined by the Center. Violations of this policy will be reported to Center Management and must be corrected before an exhibit or show will be allowed to open/reopen.
9. The sale of firearms and ammunition is prohibited in the Center.
10. The display of any and all vehicles will only be allowed in the Center with disconnected batteries and taped terminals. Additionally, all fuel tanks and fill valves must be locked and vehicles may carry no more than a total of three (3) gallons of fuel per vehicle. At no time is the removal or additional of fuel allowed in or around the Center. All vehicles used for display will be inspected for compliance with regulations by the Center, prior to the opening of the Event.
11. At no time during public hours are vehicles to be moved.

12. All emergency exits, hallways, and aisles leading from the building are to be kept clean and unobstructed. Any vehicles, material, equipment, etc, in fire lanes or blocking exits, etc., will be removed at the Licensee's expense.
13. Exit signage, fire extinguishers, fire alarms, pull stations, and related fire fighting equipment, may not be hidden, obstructed, blocked, or tampered with.
14. The Center may request, in writing, specifications, descriptions, etc., of any and all equipment, processes, operations, etc., from Licensee, service contractors, exhibitors, etc., and reserves the right to submit such information to the Fire Department for approval.
15. Exhibit hall and loading dock doors are not to be propped open. Automatic closing devices may not to be hindered from their designed performance.
